This month's Sponsor Spotlight features Chris Moore and his company Senior Remodeling Experts. Chris is a Class A contractor whose company focus is "Aging-in-Place", or remodeling for seniors and those with special needs. He also serves as the Director of Education for the Western & Central Virginia Aging-in-Place Council.

Chris has worked in construction since 1986, and was fortunate to have an early mentor. "My first job was in Palm Springs, California working for a Czechoslovakian master builder," he explains, "and that experience gave me an early foundation for craftsmanship and detail." Chris started SRE in 2001 as a framing contractor, but has become more specialized in recent years saying, "I'm passionate about solving people's problems, not just selling a service or a product."

The genesis for the focus on senior remodeling was Chris'own parents moving from Arizona to Salem some years ago. He did some work for them and in the process came to realize that most people will face the challenge of caring for or helping with older relatives. With 10,000 Americans per day turning 65, and the demographic of 80+ year olds growing at four times the rate of the general population, Chris feels as though we are headed for a senior housing crisis. Underlying the statistics is the human element of people wanting to stay in their homes as they age, rather than downsizing or moving to assisted living facilities.

In addition to serving seniors, Chris feels that the word "disability" is misunderstood. As an example, he pointed out that both he and I wear glasses, and if we were to try to drive or even find our way to our cars without our glasses, we would be disabled. He adds, "By having living spaces that are personally suited for people, we actually eliminate disabilities in their homes. We want to create spaces that are safe, accessible, and beautiful for people of all ages and abilities."
